

# **KIWANIS CLUB OF TEMPLETON FOUNDATION**

## **COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**

The Kiwanis Club of Templeton Foundation annually awards several college scholarships to selected applicants for the purpose of continuing their education at a college, trade school, or university. Scholarships are given in the amount of (\$1000.00) one thousand dollars each. Funds are given to the student **after** receipt by the selection committee of the student's approved semester/quarter class enrollment.

### ***Eligibility***

There are two eligibility requirements:

1. Applicants must be current graduating seniors at Templeton High School.
2. Applicants must intend to continue their education.

### ***Selection Criteria***

The criteria for selecting successful applicants will include (not in any order):

1. Overall grade point average of all high school subjects attempted.
2. California CST or College SAT test scores.
3. Financial need.
4. Community service and extra curricular activities.
5. Higher educational desire and motivation.
6. Community leadership potential
7. Letters of recommendation.

2. Complete each of the sections of the application as concisely and specifically as possible in the spaces provided. If more space is needed attachments are acceptable. Reference each attachment to the appropriate section letter.
3. The application deadline is Monday, April 25, 2011. The application must be **received** by mail or email by the deadline to be considered. **Do not** leave at Templeton High School as it will **not** be picked up there.
4. Attach a copy of your Templeton High School transcript to the application (It does not have to be an official stamped copy)
5. Include three letters of recommendation. (Copies are acceptable)
6. All pages are to be **one sided** and attachments must be 8 ½" x 11".
7. Please type or print in ink. Neatness and legibility affect the selection committee's ability to read and assess it.
8. Incomplete applications will not be considered. All submitted applications will remain the confidential property of The Templeton Kiwanis Club Foundation unless otherwise stipulated in writing by the applicant or his/her parent or guardian.
